01 | FOREWORD

After the extreme situation with the management of a pandemic, many internal challenges came up in 2021. After more than four years, Co-Founder and Co-Director **Seraina Soldner** retired from operations and took a seat on the Board of Directors. Also **Giordano Neuenschwander** – former Head of Office in Geneva – wanted to discover another side of the working world after almost three years at SINGA and handed over the wheel in Geneva to Elody De Brito. **The positive thing about change is that it brings new wind in the sails. Consequently, these changes guided SINGA into new waters.**

The fresh breeze brought a reshaping of the cooperation within the team, allowing us to support each other even more and cross-fertilize with ongoing inputs. Everyone benefits from this, but especially the participants of the SINGA Incubator! This was shown, for example, by the fact that almost all of the 14 participants started generating income through their projects already during the incubator. This was a first and has never happened to such an extent before!

But also former SINGA entrepreneurs were very successful and were able to generate an average turnover of CHF 28,000 in 2021.

We can look back on these successes thanks to the great support of all the experts and volunteers. This constant learning from each other at eye level is what makes the SINGA community so unique and impactful!

02 | SINGA

The first European network of innovation around migration

SINGA means **connect** in Lingala – a language spoken in the Democratic Republic of Congo – a word that conveys SINGA's mission explicitly.

The first SINGA was founded in Paris in 2012. Since then, SINGA has been unleashing the potential of migration by creating opportunities for locals and newcomers to meet and create professional, social, and entrepreneurial projects together.

Today, you can meet SINGA chapters in 18 cities and 7 countries including Belgium, Canada, France, Germany, Luxembourg, Spain as well as Switzerland.

Until now, the SINGA network has supported over 1,000 entrepreneurs and 337 startups. At the European level, 60% of supported businesses are still active after three years and 62% of newcomers who joined SINGA found a job or training through the community.

While each chapter operates independently and works according to their local needs and contexts, we share our general mission and exchange methods, know-how and best practices and build up the network together.

To strengthen our efforts and collaborations, a **SINGA Global association** was founded in Paris in September 2020 and is now pursuing more concrete and cooperative activities in the realm of **SINGA** as an international movement.



SINGA Switzerland

SINGA Switzerland was first founded in **Zurich** in December 2016 and then expanded to **Geneva** in 2018. Two offices are dedicated to running each annual cycle of the **SINGA Incubator** in order to be as impactful as possible across the whole of Switzerland.

03 | THE SINGA INCUBATOR

Inclusive Entrepreneurship


The SINGA Incubator supports people from refugee and migrant backgrounds who want to launch a business or become self-employed in Switzerland.

Our aim is to support the entrepreneurs, experts and volunteers involved in the SINGA Incubator to connect as a community, so that they can contribute their individual skills and learn from each other on an eye to eye level. By promoting the entrepreneurial potential of people from refugee and migrant backgrounds in Switzerland, we hope to contribute to the creation of a truly **more inclusive society and innovative economy that benefits all**.

Over a six month period, the **SINGA Ideation Lab** and the **SINGA Factory** impart practical knowledge about founding a company and connect participants with experts, advisors, potential customers, partners and investors. Participants can test and validate the feasibility of their business ideas before jumping into the development of their projects and preparing the launch of their services or products.

In the **SINGA Mentoring** each entrepreneur is accompanied by an individual mentor who provides advice and access to their professional network over a period of at least six months with optional extension.

In parallel, there is the possibility of optional **1:1 support** from experts from the private sector on any topic during the SINGA incubator, so that needs can be met immediately and the entrepreneurial journey can continue as smoothly as possible.



Upcoming!

The current version of the **SINGA Business** provides additional hands-on individual support to the entrepreneurs after the SINGA Incubator who are close to or in the process of founding their business. But this offer is currently being improved and expanded so that **SINGA Business will become a proper accelerator**. This will provide entrepreneurs with support tailored to individual needs on the one hand, and access to funding opportunities on the other hand, so that they can take their projects to the next level.



The SINGA Awards Celebration Event is always the climax of the year! It is the biggest annual event of SINGA Switzerland both in Geneva and Zurich and a joyful opportunity for all our SINGA network members to gather together and celebrate the achievements of that year. This event is also meaningful because we get to hear the pitches of the participants who joined the SINGA Incubator. After their pitches, in which they showcase their entrepreneurial projects, the SINGA Switzerland team carefully selects the winners of the SINGA Awards with a jury of partners, supporters and SINGA Incubator workshop leaders. Apart from the SINGA Award for each city (Zurich and Geneva), there are other types of awards that are also presented on this day.



Pranita is also one of the proud SINGA Incubator participants. SINGA Zurich met Pranita in 2020 and are still in frequent contact. Her non-profit organization Books for Change supports the development of child-friendly libraries in government primary schools located in rural regions in Nepal and India.

Pranita shared the **impact numbers of Books for Change of 2021**: 6 more libraries were founded in Nepal with 3,100 books in total. Also, 22 computers and 14 solar panels for infrastructure were distributed to schools in 2021. As a result of this great effort and work of Books for Change, 1,403 children gained access to the libraries, 294 children were reached with computer programs and 670 children could benefit from the solar panels.

OVERVIEW OF CYCLES CONDUCTED IN SWITZERLAND IN 2021










Business fields of projects supported in the SINGA Incubator 2017-2021

Mentors

The mentoring program is a collaboration in which mentors from the professional and entrepreneurial world and mentees who are participants in the SINGA incubation program are paired up to collaborate for a minimum of 6 months. During this period mentors share their ideas, highlight challenges and look for solutions in order to help the mentees develop their entrepreneurial project, providing emotional support at the same time.

Indeed, the entrepreneurial adventure is a very intense and enriching experience during which mentors are encouraged to offer feedback, exchange ideas, and share networks while remaining aware that the main actor and expert of the project is the entrepreneur herself/himself.



A long-lasting collaboration

1. What does Inclusive Entrepreneurship mean to Deloitte?

2. What do you think is the most added value gained by collaborating with initiatives such as SINGA in the framework of Deloitte Care?

Collaboration with initiatives such as SINGA gives us the opportunity to **get in touch with other people, other mindsets and a different environment** to what can be considered as our standard working procedures and social interactions. It requires us to apply and develop skillsets that can be different from daily business. It gives us access to new interesting personalities and stories, and the opportunity to share some of our knowledge and capabilities with them. In that sense, it is a very valuable personal development opportunity.

Furthermore, we are hopefully also able to touch our counterparts with our own stories and provide them with knowledge, tools, experience sharing, support and networks that will be helpful for their personal journey as entrepreneurs by enabling them to tear down some of the barriers they might encounter.

3. What are your main takeaways from collaborating with the entrepreneurs at SINGA?

It is difficult to generalise given that we have encountered very different personalities. What unites them is their passion for their individual business or initiative. It is very enriching to witness how they all come in with an own and very personal individual story. Often you can recognise how their entrepreneurial endeavour is linked to a particular part of their personal background. Consequently, they enrich our society with priceless diversity and fill blindspots, which would remain hidden or at least difficult to identify. The exchange with the entrepreneurs at SINGA bring to light how assumed small things can quickly develop development-impeding factors, and why initiatives such as SINGA are so important.

4. What motivates you in supporting SINGA and its entrepreneurs? What would you say to anyone who would like to support SINGA as a professional?

On the one hand, it enriches you personally and as an organisation. On the other hand, it is a very practical and direct way of contributing to the development of interesting personalities by facilitating their inclusion into Swiss culture (which can be beautiful, but admittedly might not appear to be the easiest to access sometimes), as well as to the enrichment of our local community. Consequently, I can only say that it is time well invested. The SINGA team itself is composed of great people! Join this great community to see for yourself!
